A CRIME ON THE BAYOU IMPACT REPORT





INTRODUCTION

In January of 2022, we designed and implemented an impact campaign for A CRIME ON THE BAYOU in partnership with filmmakers, Susan Margolin, Claire Chandler, and Nancy Buirski, and distributors Bullfrog Films and Shout Factory. In the film, Washington, D.C. attorney Richard Sobol stands up to a racist legal system to defend Gary Duncan, a Black teenager wrongfully accused of assaulting a boy in 1966 New Orleans.

The campaign aimed to elevate the film's profile and visibility by forging meaningful partnerships across the educational, legal and advocacy communities. These relationships helped illuminate the relevance of a 1960's story to today's racial justice movement while sharing the film with diverse audiences, sparking honest dialogue and inspiring action.

We worked closely with the film subjects, Gary Duncan, Lolis Elie and Armand Derfner, leveraging our contacts from past campaigns and performing strategic outreach to hundreds of organizations across the country. Our menu of offerings, including virtual, in-person, and hybrid screenings focused on a variety of topics from the film such as constitutional law, civil rights, Jim Crow, racial discrimination, criminal justice system, history, allyship, restorative justice, etc.

Over the course of 11 months, we worked with 40 key partners across 14 states, and engaged an audience of about 3,250 people who experienced the film and participated in talkbacks with film subjects and local experts. Through our relationship with state bars and law schools, we developed a network of organizations invested in using A CRIME ON THE BAYOU as an educational tool for change in the long term.

This report presents a snapshot of the campaign's accomplishments. We hope you enjoy reading.

HIGHLIGHTS

<u>THE AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION</u> presented the film at the "Equal Justice Conference" in Minneapolis. About 100 legal services and pro bono advocates attended the screening. Post conference, about 10 of the participating legal films reached out with further inquiries.

RACE FORWARD, one of the largest racial justice organizations in the U.S., hosted a virtual screening attended by 165 people, followed by a conversation with Gary Duncan and Lolis Elie. Feedback from viewers was exceedingly positive: "Your stories offer hope in light of how far we as a nation, sadly still have to go." "This film tugged at my heart quite a bit", and "It was powerful hearing Angela Davis mention the concept of Allyship. The concept never registered. She clarified my confusion."

Our <u>SOUTH CAROLINA BAR</u> Continuing Legal Education (CLE) seminar was attended by over 50 attorneys in-person at a local theater. The conversation was so powerful that director Terry Burnet, immediately introduced us to five other bars recommending the experience.

As part of the Achieving Racial Justice series, and in commemoration of Juneteenth, <u>THE QUATTRONE CENTER</u> and the <u>PENN CAREY LAW</u> Office of Equity & Inclusion presented a hybrid event, that doubled as a CLE program. Over 140 people watched the film and participated in a discussion with Gary Duncan and executive producer Brenda Robinson.

On June 18th, the film became a centerpiece of the <u>11th NATIONAL</u> <u>CIVIL RIGHTS CONFERENCE</u> in New Orleans, where Gary Duncan and Lolis Elie participated in a post-screening discussion at the Ashé Power House. The event was scheduled around sessions on restorative justice, "Know Your Rights" training and a special Juneteenth Father's Day celebration honoring Jerome "Big Duck" Smith and other fathers of the movement. T<u>HE AFRICAN AMERICAN LIBRARY AT THE</u> <u>GREGORY SCHOOL</u> partnered with us to present the film in Houston, Texas. The venue was the historic DeLuxe Theater, where about 100 people gathered to watch and engage in conversation with Mr. Duncan and Lolis Elie, who spoke remotely from Los Angeles.

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
